## Curriculum

The CAST minor is made up of three (3) core courses and three (3) electives, worth three (3) credits each for a total of **18 credits** required for the minor.

Students must have a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher, be admitted into the CAST minor, and satisfy all application requirements. Students who have taken one or more courses required for the minor prior to application can have those courses count towards the completion of the minor.

Applications will be accepted throughout the year, and students may begin taking courses in any semester. The first core course, CAST 301V, must be taken before the other two core courses.

Electives may be taken at any time - before, after or concurrently with the core courses. Elective courses are categorized into three topics. Students must take one (1) course under each topic category.

All departments who offer courses in the CAST minor have agreed to allow CAST students to take the courses regardless of their major. Some courses may require instructor approval. Please indicate to the instructor that you are taking the course as a part of the CAST minor.
